 - a. Boston was previously the home of the Butler County Community College culinary program. That space is now the home of the Create Campaign, a one-year start up incubator kitchen.
 - b. Boston offers Summer of Discovery camps, themed camps, one day camps, and they are a home school learning hub.

 - d. The pool is now a splash pad and the Cowboys football team uses their field

5. Why We Do What We Do Addressing Hypertension at Work

- a. You are encouraged to look at this data and not just with the lens of worksite wellness.
 - i. Hypertension, also called high blood pressure, is the most common health condition among US adults and affects more workers than either diabetes or depression. Hypertension 3 in 10, Depression 2 in 10, Diabetes 1 in 10.34.5% of adults in Sedgwick County per 2021 BRFSS data.
 - ii. Hypertension increases the risk for heart disease and stroke, 2 leading causes of death in the US. current guidelines is blood pressure consistently at or above 130/80
 - iii. Age-adjusted deaths from hypertension rate per 100,000 population: 2017 7.2, 2021 12.5
 - iv. ½ of adults with hypertension have at least one other health condition such as high cholesterol, diabetes, or coronary heart disease

- v. Healthcare costs are 44% higher than individuals without hypertension
- vi. Employers with hypertension average 2.3 times more hours away from work
- vii. Tools: Budget Impact Model, Claims Analysis Guide, & Comprehensive benefits design guide for hypertension 7 strategies for prevention, screening, and management.
